Global Animal Health Association, HealthforAnimals, Appoints Dr. Marc Prikazsky as New President

Marc Prikazsky, CEO of Ceva Santé Animale, was selected by his peers to lead the Association into the new decade

March 9, 2020, BRUSSELS – Marc Prikazsky, Chairman and CEO of Ceva Santé Animale, was selected to serve as President of HealthforAnimals, the global animal health association, in London last month. HealthforAnimals' Members represent approximately 90% of global market for veterinary pharmaceuticals, vaccines, diagnostics and other animal health products worldwide.

Marc was selected by his fellow CEOs on the Board of Directors to lead the Association as President. He takes over the position from Richard DeLuca, Executive Vice President and President, Merck Animal Health (known as MSD Animal Health outside the United States and Canada), who served from 2017 to 2020.

“With a rising population of people and pets, there are incredible opportunities for our sector in the coming years, and Marc will help us meet them head-on” said Carel du Marchie Sarvaas, Executive Director, of HealthforAnimals. “We also thank Richard DeLuca for his invaluable service and leadership over the last three years.”

Marc has served as Chairman and CEO of Ceva Santé Animale since 2009. His early career began at the renowned Alfort Veterinary School in Paris where he trained as a veterinarian.

Following a stint in public service in Africa, he joined the private sector where he moved up the ranks of well-known animal health companies before joining Ceva in 1999.

Marc will now serve as HealthforAnimals President, where he will help the Association lead its Members into a new decade and ensure animal health remains at the top of the global agenda.

“This selection is an honor and I thank my fellow Board Members for trusting in me to serve as HealthforAnimals president.” Said Dr. Prikazsky. “We live in interesting times where the relationship between animals and people is rapidly evolving, bringing both challenges and opportunities. I look forward to leading our association as we focus on our core role of assuring the health and well-being of animals, which will in turn benefit the health of people and our planet as one.”
